<sup>2</sup> Rehab Psychology practicum = One academic year (approximately 9 months) of supervised training, at least 8 hours per week, with at least 50% clinical contact with

rehabilitation patients, family members, and care teams.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Rehab Psychology dissertation or research project = Empirical research, extended case studies, literature critiques and analyses, or capstone projects.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> <u>Rehab Psychology supervised experience</u> = At least 50% clinical contact with rehabilitation patients, family members, and/or care teams (e.g., assessment, treatment, consultation). Seminar attendance, readings, and research may count as part of the supervised experience.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> (Not applicable) –Postdoctoral education and training in a specialty is a major area of study requiring 80% or more of time, with potential exposure to other specialty areas.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> <u>Post-licensure</u>: Specialization in Rehab Psychology occurs following completion of a doctoral program and internship. Specialization may be achieved through completion of a recognized postdoctoral training program or completion of 2 years of supervised experience in the specialty (either 2 years post-licensure or 1 year post-licensure and 1 year internship involving a major area of study in Rehab Psychology).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> <u>CE</u> – Must be through a university course or an APA-approved CE sponsor and be specific to Rehabilitation Psychology.

<sup>8</sup> (<u>Not applicable</u>) – Since specialization occurs either through a recognized postdoctoral training program or though 2 years of supervised experience in the specialty, other levels of post-licensure education and training opportunities are not relevant.
