² Cross-content competencies are defined as those in which another specialty' education and training employs attitudes, knowledge and skills in cognitive and behavioral psychology (see Klepac, et al., 2012) as a theoretical model, psychotherapeutic or consultative intervention methods, and/or research methodology. For example, a program offering education and training in the specialty of Clinical Child and Adolescent would have cross-content coverage if the primary model of case-conceptualization and psychological treatment was CBP. Thus a program might state that they have a specialty program with a major area of study in Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology, with an Emphais/Experience/Exposure to CBP.
